Ron's Ramblings

Are you ready for a Holy Week marathon?

At the end of the 40 day Lenten season is Holy Week, which commemorates the final week of Jesus' life spent in and near Jerusalem. Holy Week features a number of special worship services on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday/Passover, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. As a pastor (and congregation) to go through all of these special services together feels like a marathon. It is tiring. Some joke that after Easter morning worship we all deserve to go home and take a good nap!

Many churches across the country choose not to host services on all of these days. Some only observe Palm Sunday and Eater Sunday. Others commemorate Palm Sunday, and either Maundy Thursday or Good Friday (but rarely both), along with Easter Sunday. Still others only celebrate Easter Sunday, and do so with five or six worship times.

Here at Immanuel Evangelical Church we observe Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday (with Passover), Good Friday and Easter Sunday. While it may feel like a marathon, it is important.

The Apostle Paul writing to the church in Corinth, reminds the early Christians, "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter and then to the Twelve." (1 Corinthians 15:3-5)

When Paul shares that these events are "of first importance," it is because they are the core events of the Gospel message. Jesus was crucified, died and buried, and risen from the dead. All four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) slow down their narratives of Jesus' life story starting with what we now call Palm Sunday to recount, not only these core events, but also the events surrounding them that led to Jesus' trial and crucifixion. The Early Church considered these core events (and the teachings that Jesus gave during them) to be treasured memories. So should we.

Like the Apostle Paul, every Holy Week, I want to share with you, the church family, the events that are "of first importance." Palm Sunday is important because it recalls

Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and fulfills the prophecy of Zechariah. Maundy Thursday is important because it recounts the Last Supper in the Upper Room, his prayer and betrayal in the Garden of Gethsemane along



with Peter's denial of Jesus outside the High Priest's house. Good Friday is important because it recounts Jesus' trial before Pontius Pilate and crucifixion on Calvary, ending with his burial. Easter Sunday culminates the story with Christ's resurrection.

While you can begin to tell the story at any point, you need to experience the events of the rest of the story to fully grasp why and how Jesus died and what the empty grave of Easter morning really means. For many years, I felt that celebrating the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday was enough for that night. Yet, as I've grown in faith and biblical maturity through the years, I kept seeing that there was a missing backdrop that was being overlooked: Passover. It was the celebration of this biblical feast, which recounts the story of Moses and the Exodus, that brought Jesus and his followers into the Upper Room. It was during the eating of the Passover feast that Jesus gave new meaning for the broken bread and shared cup. Passover also looms over the events of Palm Sunday since that was the reason so many pilgrims were on their way to Jerusalem the day Jesus rode into town. Because of the Passover holiday they were more conscious of the need for a Messiah, a new Moses, to liberate the people from Roman bondage and oppression. It was also this messianic overtone during Passover that sped up Jesus' arrest by the Sanhedrin and trial by Pilate so that the idea that Jesus might be the new Moses would be squashed once and for all.

The events of Holy Week are so interconnected. Woven together they present a fuller picture of why the events "of first importance" are so important. I pray that you and your family will take the time during Holy Week 2024 to attend as many of the special services as you can. Join us for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday/Passover, Good Friday and Easter Sunday to experience the "rest of the story" and celebrate the miracles of Jesus. You'll be blessed if you do!








Missions/Outreach


MARCH MISSION FOCUS


The Senior Citizens' Program is for people ages 55 and over. The site is open Monday-
